

FOUR-PATCH QUILT

Yardage Requirements	Crib (44" x 56")
Alternating Blocks	3/4 yard (more for fussy cutting)
Four-Patches	1/2 yard (each of 2 fabrics)
Inner Border	1/4 yard
Outer Border	1 yard (non-directional)
Binding	1/2 yard
Backing and batting	2 7/8 yards, seamed horizontally

Cut the following for the crib quilt:

Alternating blocks	(3) 6 1/2" strips, subcut into (17) 6 1/2" squares
Four-Patch Fabrics	(4) 3 1/2" strips from each four-patch fabric
Inner Border	(4) 1 1/2" strips
Outer Border	(5) 4 1/2" strips
Binding	(6) 2 1/2" strips

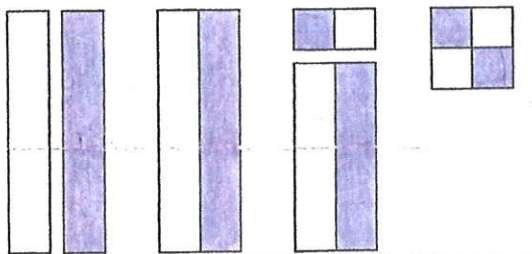
Four-Patches - Following diagram A, sew 3 1/2" strips into pairs, press toward dark. Sub-cut into 3 1/2" pairs. Sew pairs together to form four-patches. Make 18 four-patch blocks for crib quilt.

Assembling quilt - Sew alternating blocks to four-patches to form rows. Sew rows together.

Borders - Sew inner border strips together, end-to-end. Measure length of quilt, cut 2 or 3 inner border strips to this length. Sew one to each side. Measure width and cut two strips to this length. Sew to upper and lower edges. Repeat with outer border.

Quilt as desired, bind.
