



Tri-Cities Chapter Updates

For 2020, we have distributed **over 1900 blankets**—and we are expecting a surge post-COVID. Our chapter has donated over 37,000 blankets total! Thank you to all of our blanketeers!

This year, we've given blankets to Children's Cancer Hospital in Spokane (Project Linus chapter in Spokane closed), YOU Medical, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, Richland Fire Department, Children's Services, Children's Developmental Center, Elijah Family Homes, Jefferson Elementary School (Richland), Royal Family Kids' Camp, the Union Gospel Mission (families with children), Community Action Connections, Trios, Kadlec, My Friend's Place, Hospice, SARC, and American Red Cross. We also sent blankets to Santa Clarita, CA after a school shooting (A)

We also added a new agency, <u>Mo's Place</u>: "Mo's Place was founded by two licensed foster parents in Tri-Cities, WA. We serve Benton, Franklin, and Walla Walla counties. We provide emergency and after hours support to both law enforcement and child protection services, as well as emergent placement foster parents."

You can still drop off completed blankets at all of our drop-off locations (Janean's in Pasco; Joann (aka "Joann's fabrics"), Fabric108, & Discount Vac & Sew in Kennewick; Quiltmania in Richland).
